Statement in Support of the Taiwan Aboriginal Protest Delegation to the UN

In the spirit of my late wife Ingrid Washinawatok El-Issa, who gave her life for her struggles for peace, justice, and sovereignty for the Indigenous peoples in the world, I offer my unconditional support for our Aboriginal brothers and sisters' valiant effort in their fight for justice and exposure of the utmost brutal, criminal acts of Japanese Government on the Aboriginal villages (1895-1945). I stand firmly with our Indigenous family on Taiwan in condemning Japan's denial of its killing of and brutality against Aboriginal Taiwanese people. I urge the Indigenous communities from around the world to join me in demanding Japan to face up its responsibility to history: apologize to the Aboriginal Taiwanese and return to the family the ancestral tablets of the Aboriginal Taiwanese in Yasukuni Shrine.
